## About the keynote speakers

#### Ngoc Anh Tran

Ngoc-Anh Tran is a professor at the O'Neill School, specializing in the governance issues of developing countries. His current research focuses on performance management and leadership in public organizations. Ngoc-Anh is currently an economic advisor to the Prime Minister of Vietnam. He also serves as chair of Vietnam Initiatives at IU, a global network of experts on development policies for Vietnam. At the same time, he leads two major USAID projects in Vietnam to train senior policymakers and innovate the higher education system. Tran frequently works as consultant for reform initiatives by national governments, the United Nations and the World Bank, and has lived and worked in Russia, France, and Australia. He has participated in UNDP Academic Fellowship, Asia Foundation's Emerging Leaders Program, and the Vietnamese Prime Minister's Research Council. Tran is co-founder of the International Society of Vietnamese Fconomists.

### **Duc-Anh Dang**

Dr. Duc-Anh Dang is the Vice President of the Central Institute for Economic Management (CIEM), a leading governmental think tank and advisory body in Vietnam that conducts economic research to support the government's efforts in economic reforms and development strategies. He is deeply committed to advancing public policy, with his research focusing on macroeconomics, trade, labour markets, and economic development within ASEAN countries, particularly Vietnam. In addition to his role at CIEM, he is a member of the Board of Advisors for the Southeast Asia Research Group, which fosters top-tier research by emerging social scientists specializing in Southeast Asian politics. Dr. Dang also works as a consultant for UNDP, USAID, the World Bank, Oxfam, GIZ, and ADB. He earned both his Master of International and Development Economics and Ph.D. in Economics from the Australian National University.
